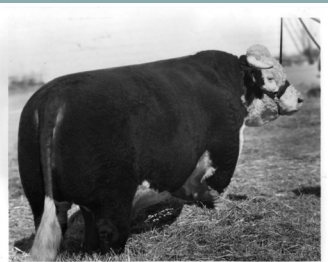
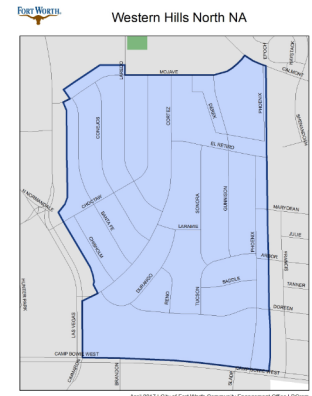

The skunks are going after food and water that has been left out for your dog or cat. According to city animal control, skunks are one of the top 5 carriers of rabies. If a rabid skunk eats or drinks from your dish, your animal may contract rabies. So, you need to bring in your food and water at night.

Need to watch out for people roaming the area and cars following the delivery trucks. There has been an increase in packages stolen from homes when delivered. Remember that Amazon has a drop-off (Amazon Hub Locker) at the QuikTrip at Calmont Avenue and Alta Mere Drive / 183 where you can have packages delivered.

10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

No watering except by handheld hose, soaker hose or drip irrigation

Monday

No watering by any customers

Tuesday & Friday

Non-residential (apartments, businesses, parks, commons)

Wednesday & Saturday

Residential addresses ending in 0, 2, 4, 6, 8

Thursday & Sunday

Residential addresses ending in 1, 3, 5, 7, 9

This year-round watering schedule is mandated by city ordinance and applies to automatic and manual sprinkler systems.

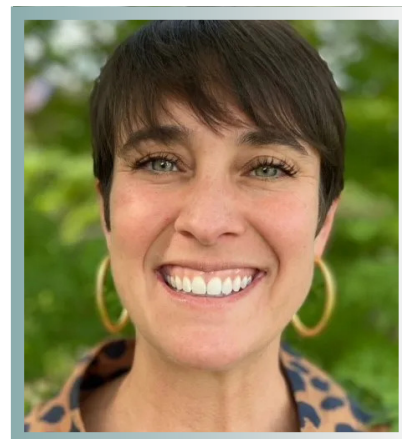
